Oh come, let us worship and bow down; Let us kneel before the LORD our Maker, For He is our God, And we are the people of His pasture, And the sheep of His hand.


We Respond to God's Call

Have leader pray the following prayer aloud, all responding with "Amen":

Prayer of Adoration

Our Father in heaven, we are gathered to rejoice that Your Son, Jesus, is our Lord and King. He died for our sins, was raised for our justification, and ascended to sit at Your right hand. From His throne above He is subduing His enemies and building His Kingdom. We thank You for graciously drawing us into the Kingdom by granting us faith in Jesus. In His name, we ask You to receive our worship and minister Your grace to us, that You may be glorified and that we may be built up in faith and equipped for Kingdom service. We ask these things in the name of Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. <u>Amen</u>.

God Cleanses Us of Our Sins

Be seated. Have leader read the verses before and after, with all praying aloud together.

Call to Confession

If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

Confession of Sin

Leader: Let us confess our sins together.

All: Merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart and mind and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. In Your mercy forgive what we have been, help us amend what we are, and direct what we shall be, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways, to the glory of Your holy name. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Stand.

(kneel, as able)

1 John 1:8

Assurance of Pardon

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

We Respond to God's Declaration

All remain standing and sing together:

The Gloria Patri

(with hands lifted)

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, World without end. Amen, amen.

Be seated.

God Consecrates Us By His Word

Have leader pray the following prayer aloud, all responding with "Amen":

Prayer for Illumination

Lord, Your commandments are our delight. Your testimonies are righteous forever. Give us understanding of Your Word that we might live. This we ask, through Christ, our Lord. <u>Amen</u>.

Have one person read each of the Scripture passages:

Old Testament Lesson Psalm 33:13-22

The LORD looks from heaven; He sees all the sons of men. From the place of His dwelling He looks On all the inhabitants of the earth; He fashions their hearts individually; He considers all their works. No king is saved by the multitude of an army; A mighty man is not delivered by great strength. A horse is a vain hope for safety; Neither shall it deliver any by its great strength.

1 John 1:9

Behold, the eye of the LORD is on those who fear Him,
On those who hope in His mercy,
To deliver their soul from death,
And to keep them alive in famine.
Our soul waits for the LORD;
He is our help and our shield.
For our heart shall rejoice in Him,
Because we have trusted in His holy name.
Let Your mercy, O LORD, be upon us,
Just as we hope in You.

New Testament Lesson Philippians 3:17-21

Brethren, join in following my example, and note those who so walk, as you have us for a pattern. For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, that they are the enemies of the cross of Christ: whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame—who set their mind on earthly things. For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself.

and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary,

and was made man;

and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate;

He suffered and was buried;

and the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures,

and ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father;

and He shall come again, with glory,

to judge both the living and the dead;

whose kingdom shall have no end.

And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son;

who with the Father and the Son together

is worshiped and glorified;

who spoke by the prophets;

and we believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church;

we acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and we look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
